

We are excited about the newly purchased building and our future home of Senior Connections. We hope to include monthly updates in each of the newsletters so all members and supporters of our program can stay informed of the progress. Keep in mind, this is a long-term project, but the results will be amazing. Please be patient and pray for the wisdom & fortitude of our Board and our directors. Also pray for grants and other financial support from our community as this will be a very expensive, yet critical project for continued growth, safety, and convenience of our members and future members of Senior Connections.





We have officially entered the initial planning phases of its much-anticipated facility project in downtown Schulenburg. While construction is still a ways off, the groundwork is being laid to ensure the building will serve the community for decades to come.

Our Building Committee is actively meeting with engineers, architects, and contractors to map out the first steps. One of the most critical issues under review is site drainage, a key factor in ensuring the long-term safety and functionality of the facility.

"This stage is all about preparation and collaboration," said Bob Stanzel, building committee chair. "We're committed to doing things the right way from the very beginning. While it may take time, these early steps are essential to creating a safe, functional, and lasting space for our community."


