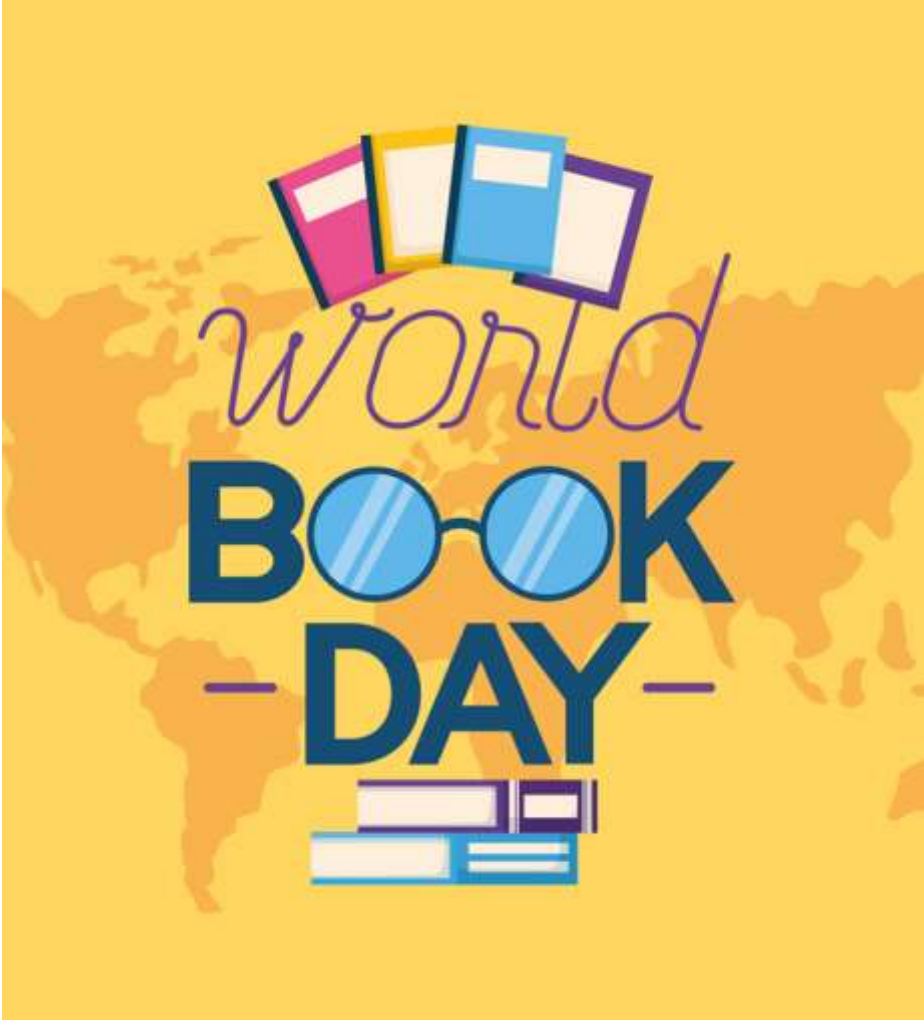

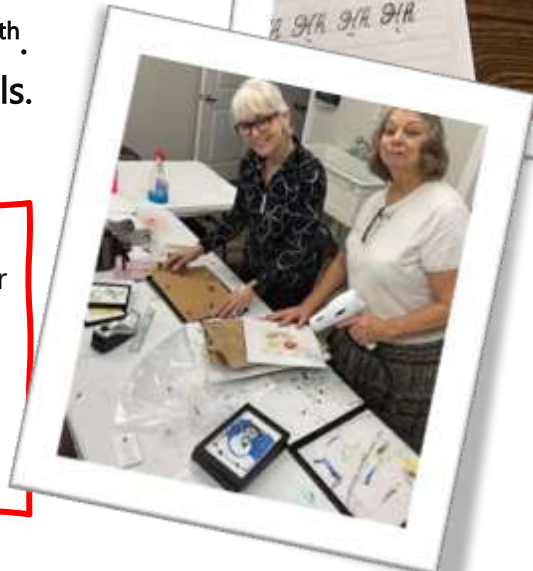


How is your handwriting? This is an example of the calligraphy projects being done by one of our fine students, **Kim Penland**.

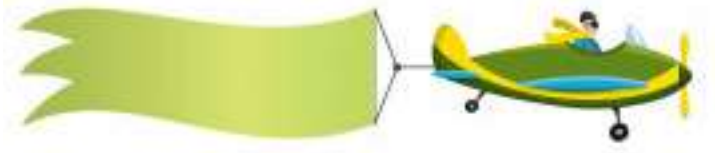


Thank you, **Mr. Lee Ehler**, for pitching in and adding plaques to our garden poles, which are soon to be distributed to many of our supporters!
